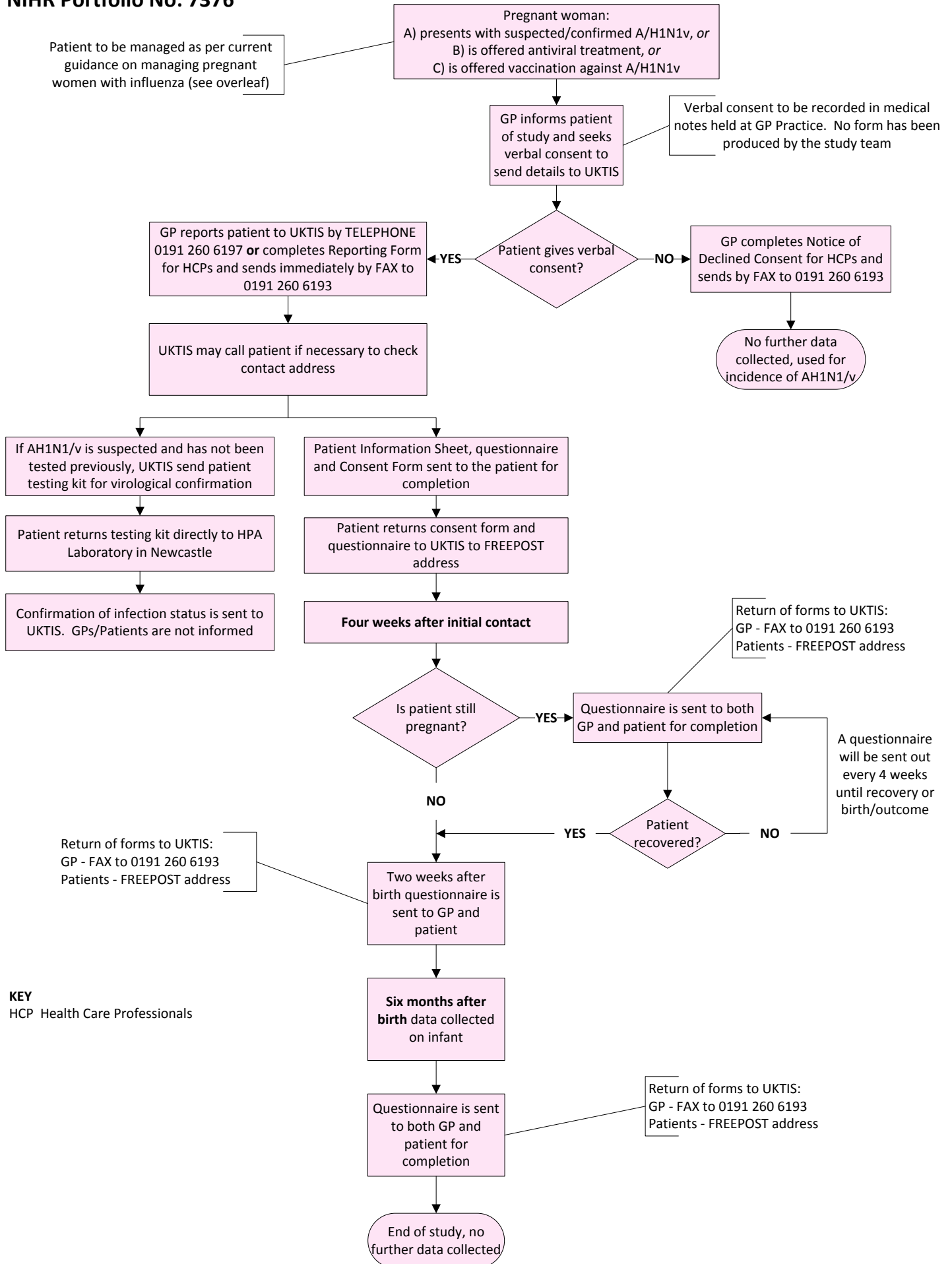


# Influenza AH1N1/v in Pregnancy: Study Flowchart – Primary Care

#### England, Wales and Northern Ireland

- Level 1: Patient gives consent, identifiable data sent to UKTIS (inc follow-up) – £115.17 per patient
- Level 2: Patient declines consent, anonymous data sent to UKTIS – £25.00 per patient
  - Level 2 also covers weekly incidence reporting by Sentinel Practices.
